We have cause to be thankful as the implementation of the COVID-19 vaccine continues across the UK and for the gradual opening up of aspects of wider society. The on-going need to act with care continues, in particular as our church buildings open up within both government and church guidelines. The situation is currently not so promising in other areas of the world, and across our church families there are many who are anxious about family and friends overseas including the Philippines and in India, which has been in the headlines over the past weeks. Horfield members will remember the visit of Saheb and Rita Borgall (parents of Shirin) a couple of years ago, and I would like to share a recent update from them about the situation in Bangalore. I invite you to pray for all areas of the world where the infection rate is still a matter of concern.

'The Covid situation here is terrifying, crematoriums are overburdened, dead bodies for cremation have stood in the queues for long hours maybe sometimes overnights (in some places for 3 days!). The plight of poor and helpless people is heart wrenching, though people would love to help but Covid keeps everyone away. As Christians we continuously intercede in His presence, at the same time trying to see some opportunities of serving our people. This time the pandemic situation is not managed well by authorities and reluctance of some private hospitals to help the poor and vulnerable is added to this plight. People are also reluctant to follow the Covid rule and not ready to take the jab. We as an organisation are in touch with a government official to provide oxygen cylinders. Hoping to hear from them soon. Each cylinder would cost between Pounds 50 to 80. If the Lord leads, we want to provide 100 cylinders to the most needy ones. This can be done only through the concerned government officials.

Pray with us. We three are well and safe. Took our two shots of vaccine, and hope it will provide some help to us. We are conducting Sunday services online and confined to the four walls. Thanks for your concern, may the Lord keep you all in good health and strength.

Lastly, by His grace, we got the approval letter from the Home Department here to receive foreign contributions. Hope in a week or two everything will be streamlined as before. Thanks for your prayers. Saheb and Rita'

Psalm 1, Acts 1: 15 - 17, 21 - 26; 1 John 5: 9 - 13, John 17: 6 - 19

This week's reflection is provided by Local Preacher and Lay Pastor, Naomi Sharp.

How do you feel when someone offers to pray for you, or prays with you? It can be a powerful and affirming experience, especially when the person praying both understands you and is someone you particularly value, or whose faith you admire.

I wonder how the disciples felt on that evening of the Last Supper. I guess they didn't know how precious Jesus' time was, how little he had left among them but I'm sure they sensed something was up. Then the very last thing that Jesus does before he heads out to the place of his betrayal and arrest is he prays for his disciples, in their hearing. It must have been a powerful moment.

The prayer begins with affirmation of the relationship between Jesus the Son, and God the Father, into which the disciples are now drawn and belong. Jesus affirms how he has revealed the Father to the disciples, how they have believed, and how they are now both "mine" and "yours," being accepted into the divine community of Son and Father. Jesus then goes on to pray that the disciples might be protected, (v.11 & 15), that they may be full of joy (v.13) and that they may be set apart, or sanctified (v.17-18). Just as Jesus has been set apart by the Father and sent into the world, so Jesus sets apart and sends the disciples.

Jesus prays this prayer over the disciples, not directly over succeeding generations of disciples like us, however other passages of scripture reveal that this prayer is not a one-off. Since Jesus' ascension into heaven, one of his roles is to continue to pray for all believers, including us. Paul writes to the church in Rome that Christ Jesus is at the right hand of God interceding for us (Romans. 8.34), and the writer to the Hebrews describes at length how Jesus is a great High Priest who always lives to make intercession for people (7.25)

As you read this prayer that Jesus prayed over his disciples and reflect that Jesus is, even now, interceding for you, how does that make you feel? What might you want to say to Jesus? What might you want Jesus to say

Lord Jesus Christ, I sometimes feel that my praying is inadequate.

Thank you that you are with me in my praying.

Jesus, you have sent me into the world, but I sometimes feel my service is inadequate; thank you that you are with me in my serving.

Jesus, although my desire is to be faithful, I know I let you down.

Thank you that you that through your intercession I am forgiven and set free. Amen.

on your behalf to the Father? How might this impact your own praying, for yourself or others?
