Bible Month, Father's Day and Sanctuary Sunday

Over the coming weeks, we have the opportunity to look at Mark's Gospel as we join with others across the country in Bible Month. Not every church will do this 'live' each week, so I plan to include something in these remarks each week and, if you are able, invite you to watch our pre-recorded worship on Youtube which will follow this theme. Do read Mark's Gospel for yourselves.

Each of the four gospels provides a portrait of Jesus, far from identical, but recognisably about Jesus with any number of well-loved stories. The whole Jesus story is not just an interesting tale; the gospel writers have a conviction about who Jesus is and what that means for their readers. As one put it, the gospels are written to tell us 'what was going on in what happened' (John Marsh, The Gospel of St. John, Penguin 1968, 20). Thus, each evangelist is an author, telling the story of Jesus conveying their profound convictions about Jesus' identity and mission, and the place of Jesus' followers in that mission.

To understand Mark, we need to be aware of two things about context. First, Jesus' ministry is conducted in an occupied land, subdued and pacified by the Romans. Mark's readers too, live under the shadow of the Empire. Second, for Jews the collective memory of exile and of a restoration that didn't turn out quite as expected, is rarely far from the surface. There are occasional signs of hope, but many are just getting on with life, and others long for the day when, once again, God would dwell in the midst of his people.

Mark's gospel seems deceptively simple. It starts at the beginning of Jesus' ministry: no birth stories as in Matthew and Luke, no 'in-the-beginning' line like John. It runs, at pace, through the ministry of Jesus, which, we would guess from this gospel, lasts about a year, before Jesus is caught up in the collaboration between the religious elite and the imperial power and ends up with Jesus hanging on a Roman cross. Of course, Mark doesn't end there - the empty tomb confirms Mark's conviction that Jesus has been raised from the dead - leaving a message of living hope.

Lectionary readings for Sunday 20 June

Psalm 133; 1 Samuel 17: 32 - 49; 2 Corinthians 6: 1 - 13; Mark 4: 35 - 41

This week's reflection is provided by Local Preacher, Rachel Spencer (Knowle).



Mark 4:35-41 'Jesus is in the boat with us' Jesus has been teaching the crowds. As the evening comes Jesus suggests that he and his disciples go over to the other shore. While they are in the boat a storm arises. The disciples are terrified and wonder why Jesus seems not to care. Jesus says, 'Peace! Be still!' He calms the storm and then asks the disciples why they were afraid, "Have you still no faith".

The geography of the Sea of Galilee is such that the water can go from calm to stormy very quickly. Some of the disciples were fishermen so they would have been used to being on the water and would have come across this phenomenon before. This storm terrifies them, though, which suggests that it was no ordinary storm. The disciples ask why Jesus appears not to care and, while they might expect him to help bail out the water, he instead speaks to the wind and calms the sea. The disciples get a glimpse of who Jesus is. At the same time, they realise that their faith is still at its beginning.

There will be storms. There will be storms in our own lives. There have been and there will be storms in our communities. We have been going through a storm globally with the COVID-19 pandemic. You may have heard the expression 'We are all in the same storm, but we are not all in the same boat'. The effect of these circumstances is not the same for everyone. Some will have welcomed the rest from the busyness of life. For others that has meant loss of work. Some will have lost loved ones. Whatever we go through we can know that Jesus is in the boat with us. At all times.

When I read this passage, my sense is one of panic. That this is not the sort of trouble that rumbles on in the background but is a full-on life-threatening calamity. When we panic, we tend to become incapable of doing much to help ourselves. We often have to rely on others to make decisions and see the way ahead. The experience of the disciples reminds us to rely on Jesus. And just as the disciples learnt more about who Jesus is, so our own storm experiences bring us closer to Jesus. Our faith, however small, can be strengthened when we trust that God will be with us.

How can we be with others in their storms? Are there ways in which we can show God's love by getting into their boat? The disciples in the boat asked Jesus, "Do you not care that we are perishing?" Let it not be that those around us would ask the same of us, "Do you not care?" We need to show our care - proactively - by being alongside others, praying, listening, offering practical help. As we show God's love through the way we are, our relationships will be strengthened, our understanding improved, and our faith increased. Let's rejoice in our loving Lord, always in the boat with us.

Prayer Loving Father, in the storms of life you are always there. Even when we cannot feel your presence, you are always there. As we seek to bring your love and peace to those around us, you are always there. In our joys and in our troubles may we know your peace and may our faith increase. In Jesus' name, Amen.
